





The 1977-78 school year at E-TC will get under way with teacher's meetings and in-service on Monday, August 29, 1977. The first day for students will begin at 8:30 at Ewen and 9:00 at Trout Creek on Tuesday, August 30.

- 1. HOT LUNCH will begin on Tuesday in all buildings with prices the same as last year: Elementary \$1.75 weekly or 40# daily. Junior High and High School \$2.25 weekly or 50# daily. Free hunch applications will be available at the school offices for interested parties on the first day of school. Special milk will begin on Tuesday, September 6 at a price of 5¢ per day. There will be one 40 minute noon hour instead of the split noon hour of previous years. High school students are to report to the gym at 8:30 on Tuesday for schedules, announcements, etc.
- 4. New Staff Members and assignments for this year are as follows: Mr. John Kaare will teach Junior High English and Social Studies. Mrs. Nina Humphrey will teach High School English. Mrs. Margaret Hammond will teach 3rd grade in Trout Creek. Mrs. Mary Ojala will teach Remedial Reading in all buildings. Mr. Mike Applekamp will teach part time in the Junior High.
- 5. Kindergarten section assignments have been made for those who have registered. These are made with consideration as to location of the child's home, bus routes, and special requests by parents. 
