



Gogebic-Ontonagon Community Action Agency announces new partnership with Feeding America West Michigan to bring more food, more often to local families

PRESS RELEASE: Gogebic-Ontonagon Community Action Agency has announced a new partnership with Feeding America West Michigan (FAWM). GOCAA will now offer The Emergency Food Assistance Program (TEFAP) in partnership with FAWM's mobile and local pantries.

By combining GOCAA TEFAP with Feeding America West Michigan mobile and local pantry networks, local families can now receive monthly combined food assistance that includes shelf-stable USDA foods from both partners as well as additional fresh produce, dairy, and bakery items through FAWM's other food sources. This partnership provides consistent access to food for those in need while combining the strengths of GOCAA's connection to the local community and FAWM's ability to provide increased amounts of food more often and at reduced costs gained through partnership.

"The goal of GOCAA is to bring more food, more often to our residents. The partnership with Feeding America West Michigan will offer a variety of nutritious food through mobile routes and local pantries and support local agency efforts to address "last mile" distribution challenges. This means that food will be available to our local families when they need it," stated Commodities Coordinator, Linda Cossi.

The GOCAA/FAWM supported distribution locations, dates, and times for both local and mobile pantries are located on the FAWM website https://www.feedwm.org/findfood/.



PUBLISHER NOTE: After receiving the press release above, I went to the FAWM website as instructed and searched for distribution dates and times for local and mobile food pantries so they could be printed in this edition of the *Ottawa Shopper*. My search rendered no results, meaning there is nothing formally scheduled for future distributions thus far for 2023. I then contacted both the GOCAA and the Portage Health Foundation (co-sponsor of the most recent Feeding America mobile food pantry distribution at the Ontonagon Firehall in March) to see if they had knowledge of future distributions. Both organizations stated they do not yet have insight into future distributions and both organizations deferred me back to the FAWM website. To that end, I will keep *Ottawa Shopper* readers apprised of any future mobile pantry distributions that I am made aware of. AND, if you or someone you know has knowledge of future mobile food pantry distributions for Ontonagon County or other food pantry information, please contact me at 404-433-7983, so the information can be shared here in future editions.

PHF RELEASES \$2,500 SMALL GRANT OPPORTUNITY

Deadline for nonprofits and governmental units to apply is April 14

March 14, 2023: Portage Health Foundation (PHF) announced the release of the 2023 Small Grants Program Request for Proposals (RFP). PHF expects to award up to \$15,000 towards successful proposals under this round of funding. There is no minimum grant amount and the maximum amount awarded per grant under this RFP will be \$2,500.

DO YOU HUNT WITH LEAD BULLETS OR LEAD SHOT - OR FISH WITH LEAD TACKLE? HELP PREVENT WILDLIFE and HUMAN LEAD POISONING

ACCORDING TO AN ARTICLE PUBLISHED IN THE JOURNAL SCIENCE, RESEARCHERS FOUND THAT 46% OF BALD EAGLES HAD CHRONIC LEAD POISONING

Lead bullets used in hunting and pest control fragment into hundreds of tiny pieces upon impact with the animal. Lead shot can also be left behind in a carcass. Many lead fragments are so small they are not visible to the naked eye but are clearly present in x-rays taken of the animals. Fragments can travel up to 18" (45cm) from the wound channel in the animal. Eagles and other scavengers eat the lead when consuming contaminated carcasses & gut piles left in the field. Lead is ground down in the eagle's gizzard and absorbed into the blood stream. Humans who eat game can ingest small lead fragments without even being aware of it.

Lead-based angling tackle, sinkers, jigs and lures are still used by many anglers. Birds such as loons and other wildlife can mistake the tackle for prey. Birds can also ingest lead if they eat fish containing tackle from a broken line, or when foraging on waterway bottoms for the grit they use to aid their digestion. Once lead has been eaten, it is usually fatal.

Non-lead fishing tackle made from metals such as steel, tin, bismuth and tungsten offer safe alternatives to lead. Similarly, solid copper bullets offer an alternative to lead shot. These bullets remain intact and will mushroom upon impact allowing the entire bullet to be removed.

While it may seem counter-intuitive to some, hunters and anglers have long been important contributors to the conservation movement, particularly when it comes to protecting waterfowl. If you hunt or fish, continue the proud conservation heritage of hunters and anglers and switch to non-lead options to help preserve wildlife for future generations.

In 2021, the U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service estimated Bald Eagle populations had soared to include 71,400 nesting pairs and more than 316,700 individual birds.

During the winter, Bald Eagles come to the Great Lakes to nest and raise their young. The best spot to catch a glimpse of these majestic birds is by visiting wooded spaces near large bodies of water, which they rely on for finding fish or grifting meals from other animals.

Some people may have

seen a bald eagle and never known it. It's easy to mistake juvenile bald eagles, which have brown heads, with turkey vultures when they are flying at a distance. A key difference can be identified in

they are flying at a distance. A key difference can be identified in that eagles keep their wings horizontal when they soar, but turkey vultures have them bent in a "V" shape.






