DNR MEETING NOTES OF LOCAL **INTEREST - SUMMER & FALL 2023**

PARKS

- Michigan State Parks in the western UP were operating at about 93.7% occupancy this summer. And, 89.63% in the eastern UP. The parks were very busy, but had slightly fewer visitors (-2.6%) than last year to-date.
- Day Use Area visitors at Porcupine Mountains trailheads were slightly down from last year.
- Bond Falls was busy, but visitor numbers dipped a bit from the past high years. There were also a few event permit weddings at Bond Falls this summer.
- Porkies Rangers responded to 11 Search and Rescues in July and August.
- Design, planning, and study continue for Lake Gogebic State Park's ARPA project. Current project focus includes wastewater infrastructure exploration and sewage lagoon area soils study, as well as campground features and utility mapping.

WILDLIFE

- The little brown bat is soon to be escalated to endangered status.
- Bear regulations were recently reviewed and a few bear management unit quotas will slightly increase. Remember to take bird feeders down, put garbage cans in garages or sheds, and put the BBQ grills away to avoid attracting bears.
- The highest number of moose-vehicle impacts ever recorded in a year was at 20.

TIMBER

- As of October 2, 289 Timber Sale Contracts are open Western UP-wide. This represents 896,592 cords of timber on 48,070 acres, valued at approximately \$34.0 million. This includes 21 GNA sales representing 84,315 cords of timber on 4,310 acres, valued at approximately \$2.7 million.
- WUP Units are reporting 27 Active Timber Sales in the WUP totaling about 2,946 acres.
- Units report low demand for demand for all product categories. Producers with mill contracts are the only ones able to move wood. Little to no open market wood is being taken.

TRAILS

- UP15 Snowmobile trail had been closed the past two seasons due to the failure of a bridge in the Sturgeon River Sloughs Wildlife Area. The bridge repair is completed and ready for the 23/24 snowmobile season.
- The north loop of snowmobile trail UP13 from Twin Lakes to Greenland will be closed for the 23/24 snowmobile season due to the large trail bridge washing out at Sleeping River Crossing out this past spring. The bridge has been removed and site is stabilized.
- Sidnaw to Bergland (UP8 SNOW/SB ORV Trail) trail is closed east of Kenton as two sites adjacent to last year's culvert repair have failed. Trail Specialist has recommended a nearly 4 mile trail segment re-build based on documentation of the existing infrastructure. The DNR is reviewing options for the winter.

Ontonagon County's Stannard Township is the only Michigan township created by an act of legislature.

Did

Stannard Township was formed in 1905, and today includes the towns of Bruce Crossing and Paynesville. Up until 1905, those towns were under McMillan Township (Ewen area). For several years leading up to 1905, Bruce Crossing and Paynesville residents had grown extremely dissatisfied with what they saw as under-representation in McMillan Township's local politics, school expense burdens, water system funding, alleged corruption, and mismanagement and sought to separate and form a new township on more than one occasion. In June 1905, the hot debate was brought to Lansing where it

was finally settled. It was officially formed through an act of legislature and was named after Michigan State Representative William L. Stannard, of Greenland, Michigan, who was a neutral party in the matter. In its early days, the first permanent building in Bruce Crossing was a hotel, store and saloon built by Donald Bruce of Ontonagon in 1886. Mr. Bruce also became the first postmaster of the area on March 1888. Hence the town's name *Bruce Crossing*.

> In the 1930's, local farmers who could not afford to buy tractors made their own. They made them out of old trucks or cars and called them bugs or *bassi*. Arnold Hanson and Gust Niemi, both mechanics were the first to make them. The picture on the right shows once such *bassi*.



Protect Yourself from Utility Scammers

An individual appearing to be a gas company employee has reportedly been going to area Ontonagon County homes and asking residents to "lock in" their natural gas rates.

This is a common scam in cities and towns across the U.S., where people pretending to be utility workers show up at your home to inspect or repair equipment, investigate a supposed gas leak or do a free "audit" for energy efficiency. They may try to charge you for the phony service, sell you unnecessary products, collect personal information for use in identity theft or simply gain entry to steal valuables.

Warning Signs

- An unscheduled or unsolicited call or visit from someone claiming to represent your power or water company.
- Threats to cut off service unless an overdue bill or maintenance cost is paid immediately.
- A demand for payment by wire transfer, cryptocurrency, gift card or cash-reload card — scammers' favored methods.

How to protect yourself from this scam

- Do call the utility, at the customerservice number listed on your bill, to find out if you're behind on a payment or if they have tried to contact you. Do not use a call-back number provided by an unknown caller.
 - Do know how utilities operate. They do not request personal information at your door or over the phone.
- Do ask questions of anyone calling you or coming to your door on supposed utility business for example, their employee identification number, or the date and amount of your most recent payment.
- Do notify the utility if you've been approached by an impostor.
- Do notify neighbors if there's a suspected scammer making the rounds in the area.
- Don't provide personal or financial information to a caller or visitor you don't know.
- Don't wire money or provide numbers from gift cards to anyone who contacts you on utility matters.
- Don't get scared. A scammer will try to convince you the lights or water are about to go out. If you're actually behind on payments, the utility will send you a delinquent notice, probably more than once, and tell you the prospective shutoff date.
- Don't let a supposed utility employee into your home unless you have scheduled an appointment or reported a problem.
- Don't click links in a utility-related email or text message unless you're certain it's from the real company.

More Resources

If you've been victimized, file a complaint with the FTC (online or at 877-382-4357) and report it to your state's consumer protection office or utility commission. If someone has opened a utility account in your name, call the National Consumer Telecom & Utilities Exchange at 866-349-5185 to get a copy of your account history and dispute inaccurate content. You can also put a security freeze on this report.





MOOSE FACTS

When the winter ice melts, moose spend much of their time swimming in lakes and rivers to keep their body temperature down on hot days, sometimes swimming without stopping for 10 or more miles.
