





- 41% of women and 26% of men reported having experienced, at some point in their lifetimes, sexual violence, physical violence, and/or stalking by an intimate partner that resulted in an intimate partner violence-related impact (including, for example, injury or concern for safety, need for housing or legal services, or help from law enforcement).
- Given how often domestic violence happens, it's likely that many of us know someone, either in our own families or among our friends or work colleagues, who have been directly impacted. Every person has the right to live free of abuse and violence.

Teaching people what healthy relationships look like combined with teaching clear and empowered communication can help to prevent domestic violence. Healthy relationships are made up of respect, honesty, trust, and communication. A healthy relationship is a partnership that still allows each party to maintain their independence and ability to make decisions. Healthy relationships are based upon economic equality (the freedom to make decisions regarding work, money, school, and other financial matters), emotional honesty, sexual respect, and physical safety.

Other Characteristics of Healthy Relationships Include: Open communication:

- Listening, understanding, compromising
- Safety to share feelings, Freedom to say no
- Sensitivity to each other's needs

Partnerships:

- Shared responsibilities and Joint decision making **Safety:**
- Physical, emotional, and sexual safety
- Respect of partner's space
- Respect of each other's sexual boundaries
- Taking "no" for an answer
- Communicating non-violently/ non-aggressively
- Sensitivity to needs

Boundaries:

- Ability to spend time alone with friends and family
- Maintaining privacy around personal technology
- Engaging in separate hobbies and activities

SIGNS OF ABUSE

Abuse is about one person controlling another. It's a pattern of behavior. You may not think of yourself as abused because you haven't been hit. Not all bruises from domestic abuse can be seen. Mental, emotional, and sexual abuse are just as painful and damaging as physical violence. Domestic abuse happens in all walks of life, all cultures, all income groups, all ages, all religions.

It is not categorized by just one hit. It is, however, categorized by repetition and patterns of violence that allow the abuser to gain control over the victim. Are you being abused? Has your partner ever...

- hit, grabbed, choked, bitten, burned, slapped or pushed you?
- used a gun or a knife or some kind of weapon against you?
- hit, held, or squeezed you so hard that it left a bruise?
- threatened to hurt or to kill you or your children or your friends?
- withheld money or food or medicine or transportation from you?
- called you names, made you feel ashamed of yourself, humiliated you?
- put you down in front of your children, your friends, your boss, or relatives or threatened to humiliate you in public?
- forced you to have sex or perform sexual acts when you did not want to?
- physically prevented you from leaving the home?
- destroyed or broken your possessions?
- threatened to harm or kill himself if you do or do not do something?

WHY ABUSE VICTIMS STAY

Some victims are held prisoner in their own homes. Assailants use psychological terrorism and brainwashing techniques to keep their victims in the violent relationship.

Some victims stay because they believe that counseling or therapy will help their batterers stop being violent.

Some victims are embarrassed and afraid of what others will think if they know the truth about their situation.

Some victims are forced to stay because they can't afford legal help. Some victims stay because there is no place for them to go. They can't afford decent and safe housing.

Some victims stay because they are not given accurate information about domestic abuse; they don't know they have options.

Some victims stay because their assailants deliberately and systematically isolate them from receiving support.

Some victims stay because they believe what their assailant is telling them: "You're crazy and stupid" - "You're the one that's sick" - "You need help" - "If you leave, I'll get custody because you'll have abandoned me and the kids"

Some victims stay because their assailant encourages or coerces them into using alcohol or other substances, and even sabotages their recovery.

Some victims believe that as long as he does not resort to physical violence, that they are not being abused or injured. (At least he doesn't hit me!)

Some victims stay because of religious, cultural, or societal beliefs that it is their duty to keep the marriage together at all costs.

Some victims stay because they want the violence, not the relationship, to end. They believe in love and they still love their partners. They may take many steps to try to stop abuse, and leaving the home may be their last resort.

Some victims will endure physical and emotional abuse to keep the family together for the children's sake.

Some victims stay because they fear their children or their own safety, or the safety of those who help them. A victim frequently faces the most physical danger when she or he attempts to leave: they may be threatened with violence or worse if they try to flee.

Some victims stay because they believe society expects them to stop the abuse, when it is the abuser who has to stop. They feel that the community will not lend them support.
