



AN IMPORTANT

Program at Ontonagon Theatre to Highlight **Online Safety**

Between 2021 and 2023, the number of online enticement reports increased by 323% according to the National Center for Missing & Exploited Children. These numbers include "sextortion", a form of child sexual exploitation where children are threatened or blackmailed, most often with the possibility of sharing with the public a nude or sexual image of them, by a person who demands additional sexual content, sexual activity or money from the child. This crime may happen when a child has shared an image with someone they thought they knew or trusted, but in many cases they are targeted by an individual they met online who obtained a sexual image from the child through deceit, coercion, or some other method.

Unfortunately, this is happening all over the world including in the Western Upper Peninsula.

To help protect our children, the Ontonagon County Child

Protection Council is having a program about smart online safety for ADULTS where the Michigan State Police Computer Crimes Unit will discuss topics such as high-risk social media apps, cyber bullying, legality of cyber bullying and much more. The program is for ADULTS only and is being held on Sunday, March 10, 2024 at 6 p.m. EST at the Ontonagon Theatre of Performing Arts.

Members of the Computer Crimes Unit are affiliated with the National Center for Missing and Exploited Children and are members of the Internet Crimes Against Children Task Force. 
