Since the 16-acre reservoir was drained in 2018, the soils have stabilized, and early vegetation cover is now established. This project will enhance the free-flowing character of this designated Wild and Scenic River branch. Blue Line Solutions, an Upper Peninsula company, is the contractor on the project. The Lower Dam removal is 50% completed and is scheduled to wrap up this year. To minimize disruption to fish habitat and sensitive species, construction for this season will begin after July1 during low flow conditions.

MICHIGAN DNR FISHING REPORT - Jun 12, 2024

- **Keweenaw Bay/Huron Bay:** Anglers in Keweenaw Bay and Huron Bay had a successful week of fishing! Anglers fishing early in the mornings were able to find salm0n on their highest lines and lake trout throughout the water column. All lake trout and salmon caught while trolling were caught using artificial baits. Some anglers opted for jigging and also had great success. Jigging events returned large lake trout and some lake whitefish as well.
- Traverse Bay/South Portage Entry Canal: Anglers reported catching lots of lake trout and salmon. Anglers who found salmon were trolling with lines down to 75 feet all the way to the surface. Anglers fishing for lake trout found them spread through the whole water column. Whitefish were caught during some jigging events as well and were found anywhere from the middle of the water column to the bottom. Fishing in the morning was the most productive time of day in this area.
- Ontonagon River: Over the past week, fishing on the river was reported to have slowed down. Reports show that walleye were being caught in low numbers. Successful anglers had the most luck when trolling in the early mornings.
- Ontonagon/Silver City/
 Union Bay: The fishing
 from these ports was slow



FREE - ASIST Training - A suicide prevention training program

In partnership with the West End Health Foundation, Copper Shores Outreach & Education is hosting Applied Suicide Intervention Skills Training (ASIST) on July 23 and 24, at Great Lakes Recovery Centers in Negaunee, MI. This two day workshop runs from 8:30 a.m. to 4 p.m. each day, teaching people the skills the help prevent suicide, and how to intervene to help keep someone safe from suicide. Those who partake in ASIST include both trained professionals and members of the general public. People do not need to have any training in suicide prevention or intervention prior to attending ASIST. With ASIST, people can provide guidance and suicide first-aid to a person with thoughts of suicide in ways that meet their individual safety needs, as well as identify the key elements of an effective suicide safety plan and the actions required to implement it. PLEASE KEEP YOUR ANIMALS COOL AND SAFE AS TEMPERATURES RISE

When temperatures rise, keeping animals cool and hydrated is essential to their health. While it is important to recognize the signs of heat stress in animals, it is even more critical to prevent this stress from occurring. Follow these six easy steps to help keep them safe:

- 1) Let it Flow: Provide unlimited cool, clean, fresh water Just like people, animals can quickly get parched in hot temperatures. No matter the species, animals should have access to unlimited cool, clean, fresh water to prevent dehydration. Also, if out in public, bring along some hydration options for your animal and avoid using shared/communal water bowls.
- 2) Know Their Limits: An animal's ability to tolerate heat varies An animal's age, breed, type of coat, and health history can all play a role in their ability to tolerate the heat. Keep an eye on them for signs of heat stress—like increased panting or drooling and being more lethargic. If they are showing these signs, it is time to immediately move them to a cooler area. Also, consider talking to your veterinarian. They will have a greater knowledge of your animal(s) and be able to give more specific guidance on how to best handle them in hot weather.
- 3) Happy Paws: Test surfaces to make sure they won't burn paws Surfaces like asphalt, concrete, and sand can really heat up in the sun, which can burn paws—or at least make a walk very uncomfortable. To test if a surface is too hot, touch it with the palm of your hand. If it is too hot for you, consider taking a different route that is mostly grass or waiting until the evening when everything has had a chance to cool
- **4) Look Before They Splash: Avoid harmful algal blooms (HABs) in bodies of water -** HABs form due to a rapid growth of cyanobacteria, also called blue-green algae, which are naturally found in lakes, rivers, and ponds. To prevent illness in animals, keep them out of areas with scums or discolored water, rinse them off after contact with any lake water, and bring clean, fresh water for them to drink. If an animal becomes sick after contact with suspected HAB, call your vet right away. Also, animal illness due to HABs is reportable to MDARD. To report cases, call 800-292-3939. In addition, to report any suspicious looking algae, email algaebloom@michigan.gov.
- 5) Get in Gear: Parked vehicles are not places to park pets Even in moderate temperatures vehicles can heat up quickly, creating dangerous conditions for the animals left inside. Leaving windows cracked open and/or parking in the shade do little to improve the situation. In these conditions, it is best to leave pets at home when you need to go out and about.
- **6) A Place to Chill: Make sure animals have a place to cool down** animals know when they are too hot and will usually try to find a place where they can cool down. Make sure they have access to shade, fans, misters, pools, cooling mats, or air-conditioned spaces to help them stay comfortable.





McMillan Township Residents!

All public water systems in the United States are required to submit a Complete Distribution System Material Inventory (CDSMI) showing water service line materials to regulators by October 16, 2024.

McMillan Township has documentation for the materials in a few of the water lines, which means most are listed as "unknown." Of the unknown service lines, the Michigan Department of Environment, Great Lakes, & Energy (EGLE) requires that we investigate 20% for direct verification, which means we have to actually *see* the lines and what they are made of. Because of this requirement, McMillan Township intends to hire a contractor to dig down to the lines on both sides of the shut off valve, as well as at the watermain. The contractor will restore the site when the work has been completed.

The locations of the "20%" that will be verified have not yet been identified. They will be randomly selected by EGLE. Once identified, McMillan Township will notify the owners of those accounts with a letter indicating the work that will be done. Verification is also required for the line that feeds into the house from the water meter. If your account is selected, McMillan Township staff will contact you to request access into the house to verify material type and size of that line. If you have any questions about this project, please contact the Township Office at (906) 988-2240. Thank you for your understanding and patience as we comply with these public water system requirements.

Following his first off-road maneuvers, Joe shared, "I'm very honored to be the first to drive your trackchair." Camp Josh also has a "shooting assist bench" with an assistive trigger device for hunters with lack of finger control. We plan to display our trackchair and shooting assist bench in Ontonagon during Maxwell Street Day. 
