


Week of July 24, 2024

Ontonagon River: Fishing efforts on the river increased amidst the holiday weekend. Walleye were reportedly Keweenaw Bay/Huron Bay: Anglers were quite successful in the last week. Those trolling found lake trout and salmon in waters above and below 100 feet, with most big catches being above the 100-foot mark. Anglers who went out and jigged were also quite successful with lake trout. Some anglers spent mornings in Huron Bay successfully jigging for whitefish as well. Traverse Bay/South Portage Entry Canal: Anglers were very successful in the last week while trolling and jigging. Jigging trips mainly produced lake trout, while trolling anglers found lake trout, Chinook salmon, coho salmon and brown trout. Fish were caught throughout the water column, with most of the kept fish being caught from above 120 feet.

Little Bay de Noc: Walleye anglers reported a slight uptick in action. Anglers had some luck trolling crawler harnesses, pitching jigs or casting reaction-style snap lures and were fishing the bottom of the drop-offs. Perch anglers reported slow fishing. Smallmouth anglers reported fair to good fishing and had success casting baits that resemble gobies.



REMEMBER TO VOTE ON AUGUST 6, 2024!

Gogebic-Ontonagon Community Action Agency Senior Citizens Programs Millage Renewal

Shall the ad valorem taxes collected on all property within the County of Gogebic be renewed for said county by 0.60 mill (\$0.60 per \$1,000.00 of state taxable value) for a period of four years, 2024 through 2027 inclusive, the taxes so raised to be used exclusively for the operation of the Gogebic-Ontonagon Community Action Agency Senior Citizens Programs in Gogebic County; and shall the County of Gogebic levy such renewal in millage for such purposes during such period, which renewal will raise in the first year of such levy an estimated \$384,924.68. (This is the millage rate that has been in effect from 2000-2024 and represents a renewal of that millage rather than an increase.)

911 Operation Renewal Surcharge

For the period beginning on July 1, 2025 and continuing through the month of June in the year 2030, shall Gogebic County be authorized to assess a monthly operational surcharge of up to three dollars (not to exceed \$3.00) on the monthly billings of landline, wireless and voice over internet protocol (VOIP) service suppliers within the geographic boundaries of Gogebic County to be used exclusively for the funding of 911 emergency telephone call answering and dispatch service within Gogebic County, including facilities, equipment and operations?

Emergency Medical Service Renewal/ Restoration

This proposal will allow the County of Gogebic to continue to levy the statutory rate not to exceed 1 mill on all property except other property exempt by law, required for the county to supplement countywide emergency medical care, equipment, training, and other related expenses for emergency medical purposes and restores millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the Michigan Constitution of 1963. Shall the currently authorized millage rate limitation on the amount of taxes which may be assessed against all property except that property exempted by law, in Gogebic County, be renewed by .9943 mill (\$.9943 on each \$1,000 of taxable value) for a period of 3 years, 2025 to 2027, inclusive, and also may be restored up to .50 mill (\$0.50 on each \$1,000 of taxable value) for a period of 3 years 2025 to 2027, inclusive, to restore funds to supplement countywide emergency medical care, equipment, training and other related expenses for medical purposes; the estimate of the revenue the County will collect if the millage is approved and 1 mill is levied in 2025 is approximately \$641,541(this millage is to renew millage lost as a result of the reduction required by the "Headlee" amendment to the Michigan Constitution of 1963 and will be levied only to the extent necessary to restore that reduction)?

Transit Proposal

PROPOSAL TO RENEW OR CONTINUE THE PREVIOUS ONE-THIRD MILL FOR GOGEBIC CO. TRANSIT OPERATIONS FOR A PE-RIOD OF 4 YRS FROM 2025-2028, INCLUSIVE: Shall the ad valorem taxes collected on all property within the County of Gogebic be renewed for said county by one-third (1/3) mill (\$.33-1/3 per \$1,000 of State Taxable Valuation) for a period of (4) years, 2025-2028 inclusive, the taxes so raised to be used exclusively for the continued operation of the Gogebic County Transit System; and shall the County of Gogebic levy such renewal in millage for such purposes during such period, which will raise in the first year of such levy as estimated \$ 213,826.66. (This is the millage rate that has been in effect from 1985 through 2024 and represents a renewal of that millage, rather than an increase).




