




OBITUARY



GOISD Board of Education Takes Action on Key Educational Initiatives

BERGLAND, MI - The Gogebic-Ontonagon Intermediate School District (GOISD) Board of Education met for their regular meeting on November 20, 2024. The Board approved several measures to strengthen special education services, including a \$10,000 Interagency Cash Transfer Agreement with Michigan Rehabilitation Services that will leverage an additional \$27,037 in federal funds for transition services. GOISD is also restructuring its special education administrative support to better serve its comprehensive programs, which currently support 101 children aged 0-5 through Early On and Early Childhood Special Education services. The department has implemented innovative programs such as equine therapy for students and is expanding its Positive Behavioral Interventions and Supports (PBIS) initiatives.

In Career and Technical Education, plans are advancing for possible major upgrades to the Ontonagon CTE facility if the GOISD is able to purchase the CTE Building. GOISD has engaged OHM advisors to develop renovation plans that will include space for a new construction program serving students from Ontonagon, Ewen-Trout Creek, and Watersmeet schools. The Board approved a CTE contract with the Ironwood Area School District for the 2024-25 school year, valued at \$21,839.

The GOISD's commitment to literacy showed impressive results, with Director of Instructional Services, Travis Powell, and staff from Ironwood Area Schools presenting at the state MiMTSS Conference about their successful literacy intervention program that achieved 242% growth in second-grade student performance over one calendar year. This success story demonstrates the effectiveness of the district's literacy initiatives and their potential for replication across other schools. Student Health and Wellness Services reported receiving additional Healthcare Resource Advocate (HRA) funding, enabling the purchase of new AEDs and critical supplies for local districts. The department has also secured \$1,047,403 in 31N funding for the 2025 fiscal year to support student mental health services. Superintendent, Alan Tulppo, reported that he has been attending local board of education meetings to present the GOISD's 2023-24 Service Report. Tulppo also noted that a workshop for new ISD and Local School Board members is being scheduled for January or February 2025. The meeting featured a special presentation from Christina Stuber, the Distance Learning World Languages Teacher, who provided an engaging German language lesson demonstration for the Board.

Other significant actions and updates are as follows:

- Approved policy updates after a second reading
- Authorized joining a national Insulin Lawsuit
- Rescheduled Jan. 2025 meeting to Jan, 22, 2025
- Approved a Success Coach Contract with Copper Shores Foundation
- Authorized hiring part-time contracted building maintenance person
- Successful implementation of the SchoolsOPEN financial system
- Expanded the Universal Service Fund (USF) account to include Little Learners Early Childhood Center
