

SAINT PAUL, Minn. 12/10/2024 – Tuesday saw the Upper Midwest Athletic Conference (UMAC) reveal its weekly award winners for the week of Dec. 2-8, and two Wisconsin-Superior Yellowjackets swept the league's basketball awards. Seniors J'Vaun Walker (Rosharon, Texas/Manvel) and Elise Besonen (Ewen, Mich./Ewen-Trout Creek) claimed awards for their performances.

Besonen saw 78-of-80 minutes in two contests last week, taking on a pair of WIAC foes in UW-Stout and UW-Eau Claire. She was responsible for seven points and three assists against the Blugolds but turned in a new career-high scoring mark against the Blue Devils. Besonen shot 58.8 percent from the field while hitting 7-of-9 three pointers as she turned in a 29point performance.





WESTERN U.P.: Teenagers in need of Michigan driver's education training to obtain their driver's license may soon have the opportunity to attend classes at the Gogebic-Iron County Airport in Ironwood. The airport board recently approved a plan to host the training sessions following a presentation by the Michigan State Police (MSP). 



Remember, it is very early season, so water holes and rocks are not completely covered.





downs in temperatures. That means early ice covers may look solid, but they are far from it. The ice covers are too thin and too weak to support human or machine weight. Ice covers hide currents, debris and underground springs that can affect the thickness. The DNR does not monitor ice conditions, but the local fishing clubs, outfitters and bait shops do. They are your best sources for local conditions. Your best bet is to enjoy the fun without traveling over ice because NO ice is safe ice. Here are a few more safety tips: Carry a cell phone, and let people know where you are going and when you'll return home. Wear a personal flotation device or a float coat to help you stay afloat and to help slow body heat loss. Wear snow cleats to prevent slipping on clear ice. Do not travel in unfamiliar areas – or at night.


ICE FISHING ON LAKE GOGEBIC

A POSSIBLE WAY TO HELP YOURSELF DURING A HEART ATTACK

When you are alone and have a heart attack, what are you going to do? Let's say you start having chest pains and they are starting to radiate in the arm and jaw. It feels like being stabbed in the chest and heart. A person who is feeling weak and whose heart is beating hard has only about 10 seconds before losing consciousness. You can help yourself by coughing repeatedly and very strongly! Deep breaths before every cough. Coughing should be repeated every second until you arrive at the hospital or until your heart starts to beat normally. Deep breathing gives oxygen to your lungs and coughing movements boost the heart and blood circulation. Heart pressure also helps to restore a normal heartbeat. FOR WOMEN: You should know that women have additional and different symptoms. Rarely have crushing chest pain or pain in the arms. Often have indigestion and tightness across the back at the bra line plus sudden fatigue.





Have You Ever Wondered... How Waterfalls Freeze?

What does it take to freeze even the fastest, largest waterfalls? Cool air. And lots of it. First, the river or water source feeding the waterfall has to freeze. Next, the water that is flowing into the waterfall must maintain below 32 degrees — but it still looks like liquid. This is when frazil ice forms. These tiny particles start to collect and hang on to rocks and other materials in the cliff hang of a waterfall. Slowly, more frazil ice anchors to this point, until there is enough ice at the top to connect to the cold rock behind a waterfall and the ice that has gathered at the bottom. Source: UPTravel.com

The Dos and Don'ts of Winter Bird Feeding Source: Audubon Great Lakes

Blue Jays, Red-breasted Nuthatches, and Northern Cardinals are just a few of the many winter birds that provide a burst of color and activity across a stark winter landscape. Bird feeders can help attract birds to your space during the winter when natural food sources might be buried beneath snow or limited in supply. Keeping your feeders up into the spring can help support birds on their long migrations north. Here are some tips on how best to feed birds this winter:

- **Use tube feeders:** These feeders are best for black oil sunflower, mixed seed, safflower seed, or peanuts, which attract chickadees, titmice, nuthatches, goldfinches, siskins, purple and house finches.
- Use hopper feeders: These feeders are best for safflower and sunflower seeds or cracked corn and, which attract all the species that visit tube feeders plus larger birds like Cardinals, jays, grackles, and Red-winged Blackbirds.
- Use suet feeders: Suet attracts woodpeckers, titmice, nuthatches, chickadees as well as the occasional wren, creeper, and warbler.
- Don't place seed directly on the ground or use platform feeders, which tend to attract deer and other unwanted guests. Mess-free birdseed options are available to purchase at stores, which can help keep the ground clean.
- Fence in your feeders, if possible, to prevent deer from accessing them.

Remember to keep your bird feeders fresh and clean for your feathered friends throughout winter. Clean your feeders once every 2 weeks in a solution that is 9 parts water and 1 part bleach, scrubbing away any debris. Dry the feeder before refilling.

DID YOU KNOW? The **Sandhill crane**, or *Grus canadensis*, is Michigan's largest bird and its oldest living bird species. Sandhills are a tall, long legged, long necked gray bird with a bright red crown. From wingtip to wingtip their outstretched wings can measure up to 7 feet.
