Daily movement is essential for good health as you age, even if you have pain or mobility challenges. You don't need intense workouts; simple, enjoyable activities count. Household chores like cooking, laundry, and dusting contribute to your movement. Stay consistent with these tasks, go at your own pace, and modify as needed to remain safe. Remember, staying active helps maintain independence. Range-of-motion exercises can reduce joint pain, stiffness, and swelling while improving circulation, strength, and flexibility. Aim to perform the following exercises at least five times or for half a song. Always listen to your body and stop if you feel acute pain.

**Shoulder shrugs and rolls:** Sit straight up with your feet firmly planted on the floor and your chest open, roll your shoulders to the front and then back. **Hand work:** Make fists with your hands and then release. After five times, twirl your wrists clockwise and then counterclockwise.

**Bicep curls:** Do with or without light weights. Use household items like soup cans if you don't have hand weights. Sit with your feet on the floor and your arms at your sides. Bend at the elbow to bring your hands up to your shoulders, and then slowly return your arms to your sides.

**Marching:** While seated or standing and holding on to a stable chair or a wall, march in place, bringing your knees up as high as possible. This exercise aims to work the hip hinge motion, so focus on raising your leg using your hip flexors.



# AS HEARD FROM A LITTLE BIRD

**BRUCE CROSSING:** On Mar. 1, Mich. State Police responded to an accident on Hwy 45 south of Bruce Crossing. # **RECIPE: Slow-Cooker Baked Potato Soup**

### **INGREDIENTS:**

3-1/2 pounds potatoes, peel & cut into 3/4-in. pieces 1 small sweet red pepper, seeded and chopped 1 package (10 oz) frozen chopped broccoli

4 cups low-sodium chicken broth

1/3 cup half-and-half

1/3 cup sour cream (plus extra for topping)

1 tablespoon cornstarch

11/4 teaspoons salt

1/2 teaspoon black pepper

4 scallions, trimmed and thinly sliced

4 slices bacon, cooked and crumbled

## **DIRECTIONS:**

- Combine potatoes, red pepper and broccoli in slow-cooker bowl. Pour broth over top; cover and cook 3 hours on HIGH or 6 hours on LOW or until potatoes are tender.
- 2. In a small bowl, stir together half-and-half, sour cream, cornstarch, salt and pepper. Remove cover and mash potatoes slightly. Stir in half-and-half mixture and scallions. Spoon soup into bowls.
- 3. Divide bacon among bowls and dollop each with sour cream. Sprinkle with cheddar cheese, if desired.

# 2025-2026 FISHING LICENSES

The U.P. walleye and northern pike seasons open Thursday, May 15.

With Michigan's new fishing license and regulation season beginning Tuesday, April 1, anglers wanting to hit the water will need to purchase a new fishing license. The 2025 fishing licenses are available for purchase now and are valid through March 31, 2026. All anglers ages 17 and older are required to purchase a fishing license to fish in Michigan; these licenses are good for all species, though additional reporting requirements apply to some species and fishing methods.


- An annual fishing license is \$26 for Michigan residents or \$76 for nonresidents (both carry an additional \$1 surcharge).
- Daily fishing license is \$10 per day.
- An optional youth fishing license is available for only \$2 for anglers ages 16 and younger.

# Things No One Says Except in the Winter: Lake Superior has warm water

Lake Superior "lake effect snow" refers to a type of snowfall that occurs when cold air moves over the relatively warm waters of the big lake, picking up moisture and then dropping it as snow on the downwind shoreline, creating localized heavy snowfall bands due to the temperature difference between the air and the lake water.

The amount of snowfall depends on the temperature difference between the lake and the air, the wind speed and direction, and the length of the fetch (the distance the air travels over the open water). Even in summer, Lake Superior water rarely gets above 55°F, making it the coldest of the Great Lakes.


